1.	<p>The increase in the influx of immigrants that has taken place in recent years in Greece, and in particular the year 2015, when the number of their arrivals, demonstrates the need to implement a strategic one planning to protect public health and addressing the dysfunctions of primary health care provision. The meaning of the provision of PRM to migrants and refugees presents multi-faceted socio-economic dimension ensuring social cohesion, the promotion of the health of all non - discriminators and the integration of migrants into the productive fabric of the country.
